1,000 BOOKS BEFORE KINDERGARTEN

The 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program is designed to prepare young children for a brighter future by encouraging families to read together. Reading to babies helps build bonds, vocabulary, and habits. According to one study, reading to children at age 4-5 every day has a significant positive effect on their reading skills and cognitive skills later in life.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

The libraries in Washington County value helping community members find the right employment for them. The libraries computers were used times in 2019. These computers give residents high speed access to the internet to search for jobs, fill out job applications and compose resumes, and take classes. In addition we offered access to over 750,000 items in 20 libraries through our WAGGIN Network, as well as access to Gale Courses which lets every library user in our 3 County region take 10 week courses on a variety of subjects like Excel, and Quickbooks.

MEDIA CENTER




The Washington County Library System believes in inspiring lifelong learning, and advancing knowledge. The Media Center allows county residents to share their knowledge with the world by creating educational videos and Podcasts on subjects that they can then share with the world.


The Media Center is an audio and visual studio that gives members of the community the chance to make their own video and audio recordings.

The video studio is also known as the One Button Studio. It is based on a design created by Penn State to allow students to practice presentations without a need to find someone to help set up and run equipment. Users of the studio need to only insert a flash drive and press a silver button to begin a countdown to their recording.

The Audio Recording Studio allows users to create and edit their own sound files (such as mp3s). It consists of 3 microphones, 1 that is designed to operate best in the vocal ranges, and 2 that are optimized to be used with instruments.
